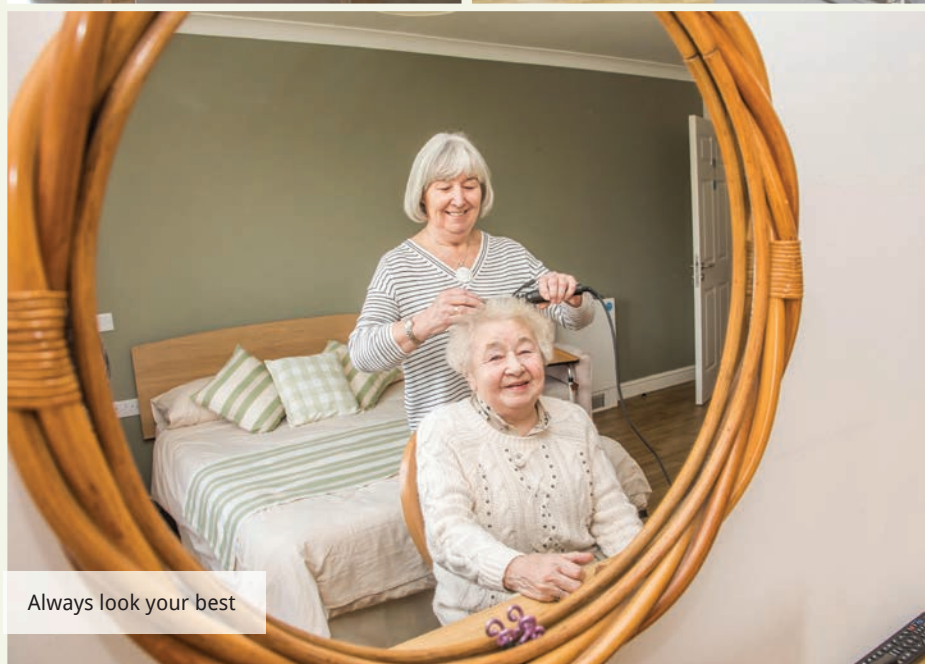
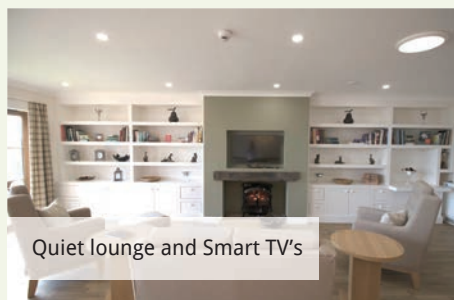

Barrowhill Hall consists of two independent care centres being Barrowhill Hall and Churnet Lodge. Churnet Lodge focuses on providing a socially supportive environment for those living with the early stages of Dementia. Care plans are carefully compiled, updated and are overseen by our management team. Whilst Barrowhill Hall offers care and support for people who have more complex needs requiring the meticulous formulation, implementation and evaluation of bespoke, person centred care plans by our dedicated and professional nursing team.

Both Barrowhill and Churnet Lodge have been specially designed in accordance with the innovative Stirling Academy guidance along with our own research into how to enhance the living environment for people living with memory loss. We have a mixture of larger and quieter lounges, film rooms, a library, spa and hairdressers. The outdoor space is extensive and has far reaching views of the local countryside and the formal gardens of the JCB world headquarters.

All bedrooms are appointed to the highest standards and the majority offer en-suite accommodation. We can also accommodate couples in a studio with a bedroom adjoining a quiet lounge. 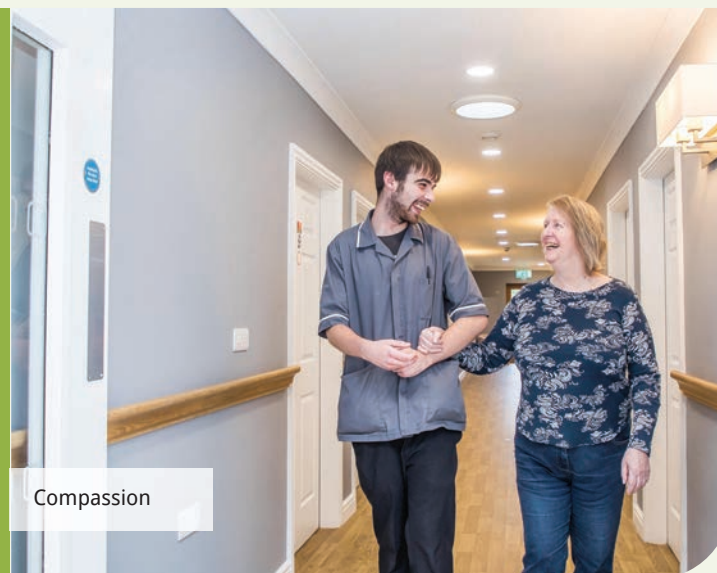

Residential Care

The choice to move into residential care is always difficult, however here at Barrowhill we believe it's a positive choice, with an opportunity to forge new friendships and live an active lifestyle. This is achieved by offering stimulating social activities and accommodating staff which go out of their way to allow individuals to do what they want in our unique community. Lives are lived with purpose while all the time being carefully overseen by our MSc Dementia Qualified Staff.



Compassion

Dementia isn't a condition that only impacts our lives in the twilight years. People with dementia whose symptoms started before they were 65 are often described as 'younger people with dementia' or as having young-onset dementia or work age Dementia.

It's currently estimated that the number of people living with young onset dementia is around 42,000. But it's difficult to say how many people are affected. This is because people may not associate their symptoms with dementia because of their age. They might be reluctant to visit their GP and when they do, their symptoms may be put down to stress or depression because they are still working.

Appropriate care

It is a difficult decision to move a loved one who is so 'young' into a home. Not all care homes are able to offer an appropriate place for people with young onset dementia. Here at Barrowhill Hall our focus is on person centred care and looking at the person rather than the diagnosis, it's because of this, we find that the time in which a person's journey with dementia starts can often impact in the way in which we tailor the care delivered to the individual.

In the case of those living with Early Onset or Young Onset Dementia what we deliver is tailored for that younger person, we understand younger people often have different need and require some different support and different cognitive stimulation based on likes, needs and preferences. For this very reason, we have x 4 full time activities staff.

Residential and Nursing care homes are often geared to the needs and preferences of those in their 80s and so the décor might feel very alien and discomforting. There might also be limited space inside the home. Both Barrowhill Hall and Churnet Lodge have wide and airy corridors and multiple lounges for residents to enjoy.

3. Activities



We have a full time Team of activities coordinators who plans a varied programme of activities that are entertaining and socially stimulating as well as being tailored to the individual. We actively engage with the community be mean of attending events and hosting visitors and events at the home.

We have three full time activities coordinators offering a very comprehensive and person centred approach to activities with a very busy and stimulating program, also the care team are very pro-active when it comes to facilitating occupation and engagement for residents, activity's include: excursions, entertainers, cinema evenings, tea mornings, arts and crafts, gardening, school visits amongst many other things. The Activities team strive to keep residents active, engaged and promote independence even for those in need of the most care.

5. Living at Barrowhill Hall

Barrowhill Hall offers spacious, homely luxury with the latest modern facilities to help those individuals living with memory loss. The home offers free ultra-high speed Fibre Optic Wifi for all residents and visitors.

Bedrooms

All bedrooms are private, exquisitely decorated and generous in size, featuring en-suite bathrooms, seating areas and modern amenities. The majority of bedrooms have views over the surrounding valleys and countryside. The rooms have been furnished to reflect the peace and tranquillity of the living environment, but we encourage everyone living with us to put their personal stamp on them, should they wish.

There is also the choice of a studio apartment, with an interconnecting bedroom and private lounge/dining area. These are perfect for couples or anyone requiring slightly more space.

For ease of access, a host of mobility features are discreet but essential touches. Nurse call systems help residents receive assistance at the touch of a button and specialist design means that doors are easier to open, the timber effect anti-slip flooring is consistent throughout the home to remove sensory obstacles for residents, whilst the specific lighting design helps maintain safe and comfortable environment.

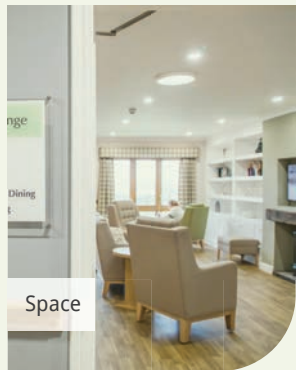

Living spaces

We have a mixture of communal rooms which offer a variety of tranquil settings, creating an important therapeutic atmosphere. We have a range of homely lounges, some offering large smart TV screens for films nights and others offering quiet reflection space with beautiful views out of the windows. We have a library, country kitchen and activities and entertainment areas for residents to enjoy the community atmosphere, promote independence and achieve positive outcomes for our residents.

There is a professional hairdressing salon in both households and in Churnet Lodge we have a full spa facility including a treatment room and a spa bath with soothing lighting and music.

We have extensive grounds with safe and secure gardens where you can take a stroll, do a spot of gardening or sit and have a drink on the terrace whilst soaking up the view. Occasionally the original lawn tennis court is re-instated and the odd game of tennis played whilst having summer BBQ's, picnics or afternoon teas.

7. The Local Area



Uttoxeter Races (Ladies Day)

Located on the crest of a hill, moments from Denstone Village (the river Churnet) and a short 5 minute drive to the bustling market towns of Uttoxeter and Ashbourne.

We have the outstanding Peak District on our doorstep and panoramic views from all aspects of the home over the Derbyshire and Staffordshire countryside.

The area itself is steeped in tradition.

Less than 1 mile away is the beautiful JCB Headquarters with its prestigious lakes and gardens. JCB have also recently finished developing their 240 acre PGA standard Golf Course designed and built using industry leading technology and developers. The Uttoxeter Racecourse is only 5 miles and hosts regular events including the Midlands Grand National! The Royal Shrovetide Football match is a fantastic local event which is held in Ashbourne on Shrove Tuesday and Ash Wednesday and having been played annually since the 12th century. 20 miles away you will find the 'Potteries', famed for household names such as Spode, Wedgwood and Royal Doulton. The prestigious Denstone College and Abbotsholme Schools are both visible from the home with the world famous Alton Towers only 3 miles away near the quaint village of Alton.

In the village of Denstone there is the multiple award winning Denstone Farm Shop which was recently voted the UK's 'best Large Farm Shop & Café/Restaurant of the Year' owned and managed by husband and wife team Emma and Rupert Evans. It's the ideal location for quick cups of tea, business meetings, drinks and meals with friends, lazy lunches & even special occasions.

2. From Uttoxeter - Bus - 32A/A1/SW1 to Northfield Avenue, Rocester and short journey to the home thereafter.

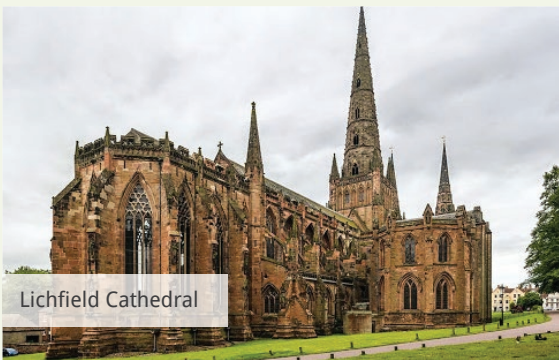
